1. Horticulture

After 1989, horticulture of the Czech Republic changed its structure.

In the sector of flower growing there are 1,150 manufacturing companies with the total production of EUR 43 mil., the producers of especially pot and flower-bed plants.

In the sector of the decorative tree nursery, there are 1,500 companies. Traditionally, they concentrate on and produce a wide range of decorative tree species and perennials.

Production of decorative plants and trees is characterized by a huge variety of species and high number of quality categories, resulting in splitting of manufacturing companies.

In the production of flowers - fresh cut flowers are on the top position (34 % of the total flower consumption), the second position goes to pot flowers (32 % of the total flower consumption), especially the pot ones that flower in the Christmas and spring periods, and bulb and balcony plants in containers.

In the development of the fruit tree nursery, the situation is getting better along with the awarding of the grants for the planting of orchards. Production focuses on so-called "club species", production for small consumers and production for the landscape renewal – planting of landscape elements such as avenues, wind-breaks and planting of bike paths.

2. Horticultural education

These days, there are 7 specialized three-year study or four-year study horticultural schools in our country and at another 8 schools, horticulture is included as one of their fields of study.

As a consequence of the population decline, the interest in horticulture studies diminishes.

The problem of secondary schools appears to be the lack of cohesion between school and practice when choosing a school – applicants are not bound to any company or firm and their motivation is to graduate from the secondary school without any deeper interest in this field of study.

Besides, there is also indistinct specialization: a student is taught flower growing, orchard growing, vegetables growing, as well as fruit growing or floristics as one of the subjects.

Recently, more attention is paid to flower growing, floristics, orchard growing and orchard design.

As regards further education in this field of study, The Faculty of Horticulture of Agricultural University of J.G.Mendel in Lednice na Morave occupies the leading position. Its studies concentrate on horticulture or garden and landscape design.

2.1 Secondary School of Horticulture in Rajhrad

Its history began over 100 years ago.

At present, it offers the following fields of study:

Gardener - three-year apprenticeship studies (one week of theory alternates with one week of practical training - either on school premises or in a gardening company)

Horticulture – four-year studies finished with a secondary education exam (25 days of practical training per year – either on school premises or in companies)

Ecology - four-year studies finished with a secondary education exam


